

# Student New Angle Prize (SNAP)

## Writing competition open to all University of Suffolk students

You are invited to submit a piece of writing which has an East Anglian connection; this could be a theme, topic, influence or association.

### Guidelines for submission:

- This prize is free to enter and open to all currently enrolled part-time or full-time students at the University of Suffolk.
- Students must not submit any work that is to be or has been submitted for assessment on any course at the University of Suffolk.
- Only one entry per student is allowed.
- The work may be poetry or prose and can be fiction or non-fiction.
- The piece should be up to 500 words in length. Choose an easy-to-read point 12 font and add the word count at the end of your piece.
- The writing must have an East Anglian connection, theme, topic, influence or association.
- There will be cash prizes: £100 for the winner and £40 for the runner-up.

Entries will be numbered and judged anonymously.

Writers need to give personal details on a separate sheet of paper: full name, Student ID number and the course on which they are enrolled.

Entrants should submit their word-processed entries to Reception at the Waterfront before noon on Friday 2 February 2018. The work should be submitted in an envelope addressed to:

The biennial New Angle Prize for Literature was started in 2009 and is open for works by published authors set in East Anglia or influenced by the region.
